

Nautical Flags





Make your own nautical flags!

President Kennedy loved to sail. Sailors sometimes use flags to send messages to other boats.

- 1) Write down your initials.

- 2) Find the letter V on the chart. Do you see that the symbol is a red X? Now, find the symbols for your initials on the chart.

- 3) Draw your initial flags.



- 4) Using **construction paper**, cut out the shapes you drew and glue them on **index cards**. You can also draw the shapes on a piece of white paper and color them in with markers or crayons. Now you have 3 flags that spell out your initials! You can staple your 3 flags onto a large string to display.
- 5) Try the nautical code puzzle to practice!




